Attendance Matters



TOP 10 - Routines, Tips, Organisation to Support your Child's Attendance.

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine; this makes everyone feel in control and helps the start of the day feeling good.
- 2. Set more than one alarm be on time, everyday.
- 3. Lay out clothes, shoes and bag, organise lunch the night before.
- 4. Don't let your child stay at home unless they are truly unwell.
- Avoid unnecessary absences. Keep in mind complaints of a stomachache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, pastoral team, or other parents for advice on how to make them feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- When your child seems better they may arrive to school for afternoon lessons. (Half days count towards school attendance, but also can help children feel more confident about returning to school after illness.)
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbour, or another parent.
- Talk about the importance of attendance at home use examples about how attendance is regarded in the work place.
- 10. If your child attends an <u>unavoidable medical appointment</u> during the school day, <u>minimise the</u> time they miss out of lessons by returning them to school the same day or asap.

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
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2 - Writer of the Week - Lara Pereira

Message from West Mercia Police



Dear Parent/ Guardian,

We are writing to you following a number of concerns that have been raised by the local community regarding the use of E-scooters and hoverboards on the road network.

We understand that buying one can be tempting, especially as you can get them from many popular retailers. It can also create confusion as it is legal to buy them but becomes illegal to use them in any public place, road, pavement, or cycle lane. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land. The reason for this is that e-scooters are treated, in legislation, as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements including:

- MOT
- Drivers Licence (Class Q)

Road Tax

Insurance

To outline that it is currently not possible to obtain insurance for e-scooters in the U.K.

You may have seen e-scooters for hire, but these were subject to exemptions as they were part of a government trial. There are currently no government trials taking place within West Mercia. If your child is found using an e-scooter or hoverboard in the above circumstances the Police Officer/s may use powers provided to them to seize and destroy the scooter. Every effort will be made to contact you immediately and, if applicable, arrange for you to collect your child from the location. In some circumstances, there may be offences committed by parents of allowing or permitting your child to ride without insurance or a driving licence.

The aim of this letter is to educate the community about the risks of using e-scooters in a public place and hopefully this letter will prevent enforcement being required. We would very much seek your support in our approach to safeguarding children and help us to reduce the risk of harm to your child and to other vulnerable road users. For further information please visit the West Mercia Police website and type in 'e-scooter' to the search area.
