Eco Council visit to Recycling Centre









On Tuesday 17th October, Church Hill's dedicated Eco Council had the opportunity to visit the Envirosort Recycling Centre in Worcester. Children enthusiastically participated in a range of hands-on activities, while learning all about the recycling process. Important environmental issues and ways to save money on bills by *being greener* were also explored. During a tour of the factory, the eco team observed how locally recycled materials are sorted, cleaned and packed, as they whizzed by on a series of conveyor belts into dozens of complex machines. All of the material ends up packed into square bales ready to be made into new usable items at factories across the country. Information on recycling will be shared with the wider school during assemblies and our motivation to recycle has never been higher!

Safeguarding with Attendance and Unauthorised Absences.



<u>Unauthorised</u> absence is where a school is not satisfied with the reasons given for the absence. Absence codes on registers are as follows:

•Code G: Holiday not authorised by the school or in excess of the period determined by the head teacher. If a school does not authorise a leave of absence for the purpose of a holiday but the parents still take the child out of school, or the child is kept away for longer than was agreed, the absence is unauthorised. The regulations do not allow schools to give retrospective approval. If the parents did not apply for leave of absence in advance the absence must be recorded as unauthorised.

•Code N: Reason for absence not yet provided Schools should follow up all unexplained and unexpected absences in a timely manner. Every effort should be made to establish the reason for a pupit's absence. When the reason for the pupit's absence has been established the register should be amended. This code should not be left on a pupit's attendance record indefinitely; if no reason for absence is provided after a reasonable amount of time it should be replaced with code 0 (absent from school without authorisation).

 Code O: Absent from school without authorisation. If the school is not satisfied with the reason given for absence they should record it as unauthorised.

Code U: Arrived in school after registration closed. Schools should actively discourage late arrival, be alert to patterns of late arrival and seek an explanation from the parent.

Pupils who arrive late after 9am receive an UNAUTHORISED (U) absence on their attendance record, unless it's for medical reasons.

This year, the two age categories will be **5-7 year-olds** and **8-11 year-olds**.


Children of all abilities are encouraged to use their creativity and imagination to write a story they would love to read!





7SF- Chloe Baralli for having such a fantastic attitude and always being polite and kind.


7JL – Jess Williams for being an excellent role model and setting herself high standards – well done.

MATHS - Nella Dordzik (7JL Maths) for showing excellence when completing her work on Place Value this week. **Tobi and George T** Super work in maths this week.


