If there are any problems with booking a slot, please don't hesitate to send and EPraise message to your child's teacher and they can assist you in booking an appropriate time.

Respect

At Church Hill Middle School, we pride ourselves on our values, developing skills and beliefs that will stand us in good stead when we leave school and enter the wider world.

Respect sits at the heart of what we do: respect for ourselves, respect for others, respect for our environment.

We strongly believe that our children need to learn to deal with conflict and disappointment in a respectful way, whilst still standing up for what they believe in. We will be working on this further with the pupils after half term, working with the children to develop their skills of disagreement and their respect for the rules of school and the wider world.

We are here to help and are keen to work with you and support where we can.

Reminders

As mentioned above, we work hard with our pupils on our values and what it means to be a member of Church Hill Middle School. Below are a few reminders for after half term:

- Uniform pupils wear school uniform each day, including plain black shoes, unless they have
 P.E. If pupils are not in the correct uniform, spare uniform will be provided from our uniform store for them.
- P.E. kit on days when the pupils have P.E. they can bring a hoodie or sports jumper to wear when they are doing P.E. At all other times, they must remove this. If they are cold around school, pupils are to wear their blazer. They can bring a school coat to wear during social times if needed.
- Mobile phones We understand that many pupils need to bring mobile phones with them
 because of their journeys to and from school. However, phones are not permitted to be out
 of their pockets or bags at any point during the school day. Use of a mobile phone during
 school time will result in the phone being confiscated and a C2 issued.
- Lunchtime etiquette During lunchtimes, pupils eat their lunch with their peers in the lunch hall. We promote the notion of a sociable lunch, with pupils eating with their friends and enjoying conversation. We expect pupils to conduct themselves well during this time, with them tidying up after themselves, not shouting nor throwing food.
- Playground etiquette During social times we expect the pupils to show respect for their environment by not dropping litter. We also expect them to show respect to their peers by not involving themselves in any physical play or contact.

Bailey - 6BD


Lilly Hopkins – 6JE

The boys drew their first game against Woodrush, after seeing a last second shot bounce off the rim. They then went on to draw their second game too, against Birchensale.


In their final game, despite dominating for the majority of the game, tiredness prevailed and the boys lost to Saint Bede's.




