For always being willing to work collaboratively with every other child and doing so with a smile!


Amelia-Rose Pullen - 6JE

Jam Club Workshops



We had some amazing performances and can't wait to hopefully see some of these children signing up to Jam Club, and performing more in the future!





















We will also be running a competition across the school which will be starting on Friday 9th February 2023. Please see the poster below:
